


## Does your cat have ARTHRITIS?



# Would you know the SIGNS of FELINE PAIN?

When early signs of arthritis pain are missed or dismissed as aging, the inflammation associated with the arthritis continues to build, contributing to damage in the joint further increasing pain associated with arthritis.

With degenerative arthritis affecting a large majority of older cats, knowing the signs and symptoms of chronic feline pain is key to helping owners avoid overlooking the less obvious signs of pain and or dismissing them as merely signs of old age.

If you think your cat may be suffering from arthritis pain, SCHEDULE AN APPOINTMENT for a routine check-up or a geriatric exam to get a baseline of your cat's health. If you cat is diagnosed with degenerative arthritis, know there are treatment options available.

### Study Requirements

The advoCATes study is designed so that throughout the study your cat will be receiving the same treatment (active treatment or a placebo).

Monitoring your cat during the study requires a visit to the study site approximately every 28 days until Day 196, for a total of 7 visits after screening.



## Free Testing and Exams

All study treatments, exams, and monitoring will be performed by your study team at the clinic.

Enrolled study cats receive the treatment, as well as study related exams and lab tests, for free.



#### **FDA Guided Study**

We are partnering with the study sponsor to conduct the advoCATes pain study, which is overseen by the FDA.

Any veterinarian can refer a case to for evaluation. If you, or someone you know, has a cat experiencing discomfort and decreased activity due to arthritis, please share this information with them.
